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# 2016 Annual Report

As stated in the 2015 annual report, the transition of a medical based director of health to that of a fiscal minded director of health would be challenging. The challenge was taken head on and the Holmes County General Health District is emerging from a time of uncertainty and transition to that of a time of growth and quality improvement. Financially, the Health District is looking at ways of improving revenue while at the same time making sound financial decisions by eliminating or reducing expenses. Cash flows have improved and transfers between funds was not needed this last year. We continue to add revenue sources for programs we are currently performing by writing grants. It is my purpose to make sure I can be as efficient as possible with local resources, and bring the community's tax dollars back from state and federal sources, to do projects and programs that benefit the citizens of Holmes County.

The Health District continues to focus on Public Health Accreditation and is making great strides in completing the effort. Accreditation focus is that of continuous quality improvement. It is an expensive undertaking, but with sound department leadership from the division directors this will make operations more efficient. It is estimated that local health departments will spend upwards of \$150,000 a year to achieve these activities. I never want the burden of this cost to impact local services, thus we continue to apply for grant funds to achieve this process.

This last year the Health District met with the director of the Ohio Department of Health and shared our support along with the communities for a local health department to be present in Holmes County. During the meeting, the director was updated on our efforts and abilities to carry out the programs of the Holmes County General Health District and our future plans for Accreditation.

The future is bright in Holmes County, and the Health District wants to be part of a future to ensure that we are "Working with our community to protect and improve the health and environment of those who live, work, and play in Holmes County".

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# The Holmes County General Health District is devoted to improving the health and well-being of Holmes county and offers the following services to the community:

## **Personal Health Services**

School Health Services: Hearing, vision, scoliosis screenings and health resources for teachers and parents.

<u>Public Health Nursing</u>: Consultations and disaster preparedness training.

Bureau of Children with Medical Handicaps (BCMH): Services for children with medical disabilities.

Communicable Disease: Case investigation, education, tuberculosis testing, and follow up.

Immunization Clinics: Offsite locations throughout Holmes County.

Help Me Grow: Home visiting for children 0-3 years to provide parents with education and coordination of services.

Breastfeeding Resource Center: Education, counseling, support and equipment for sale or rent to help mothers successfully breast-feed.

Women, Infants, & Children (WIC): Nutrition education and supplemental food program for pregnant/breastfeeding women and children 0-5 years.

<u>Injury Prevention</u>: Coordinate programming for seniors and build relationships with agencies servicing seniors in an effort to prevent falls.

Small Health Care Provider Quality Improvement: Builds capacity among primary care practices to monitor care provided to patients

#### **Environmental Health**

<u>Food Protection</u>: Licensing/ inspection of food service operations and retail food establishments to prevent food-borne illnesses. <u>Sewage Treatment</u>: Site reviews and permits to install/operate sewage treatment systems.

Water: Site reviews for new/altered wells, bacteriological and chemical analysis of water samples for new and existing wells.

Recreational Sanitation: Licensing/inspections of RV parks and camps, public swimming pools and spas.

Rabies Control: Investigations of animal bites, enforcement of quarantines, and rabies surveillance.

Nuisance Abatement: Investigation of public health nuisance complaints, issue abatement orders, compliance monitoring.

<u>Vector control</u>: Surveillance of mosquito activity, collection of mosquitoes/ticks for testing, and mosquito spraying/larvaciding. <u>Solid Waste:</u> Licensing/inspections of solid waste facilities.

Housing: Loan approval inspections of water and sewage treatment systems.


<u>Public Health Emergency Preparedness</u>: Development of plans and procedures for responding to public health emergencies.
